Knit a teddy for Bridport Hospital Minor Injuries Unit BASIC PATTERN

<u>Instructions</u> Size 10 needles, DK wool, main colour—head and paws, trouser colour, jumper colour, scarf colour.

Cast on 10 sts main colour, K 10 rows. Change to trouser colour K 30 rows. Make another leg the same. K across all 20 sts and work 16 rows. Change to jumper colour and K 24 rows. Change to main colour for head and also change to stocking stitch. Work 14cm (5½ ins) and change to jumper colour. Continue remainder of teddy in reverse order.

Stitch down sides of head. With jumper colour pick up 8 sts either side of neck join and K 20 rows. Change to main colour and K10 rows for paws. Sew up teddy, leaving an opening in crotch. Stuff (please use only kapok or polyester filling—not foam rubber).

Draw a thread around the neck. Sew diagonal top corners for ears. Sew a HAPPY face on teddy.

Scarf: Cast on 75 sts, K 4 rows, cast off. Tie on teddy, sew FIRMLY to back of neck.

Please leave Teddies for donation to the Hospital Minor Injuries Unit . A sick or injured child is waiting for one.
